# A Unique Enterprise

The concept of developing an operation theatre complex by the 1978 graduates of the Dow Medical College has proved to be better than the dream itself. As the counter of all zero cost surgeries for the patients is increasing, the prospect for even better treatment of poor patients is also on the rise.

About eleven thousand surgeries of worth rupees 250 million approx have been performed in different disciplines in the OT Complex. This has been achieved through the combined effort of the Civil Society and Dowites Operation Theatre Welfare Society which includes the philanthropists whose unconditional support has carried the project through. Despite many hard times, the sympathetic corporate and the untiring team has all

earned their place of honor in this project.

Out of total number of fourteen theatres, thirteen are functioning, six in the capacity of general surgery, two under ophthalmology, two for ENT and three of specialist surgeries. To broaden the horizon of available disciplines and maximize the number of surgeries, we wish to see all theatres functioning, for which we need funds to meet requirements like the purchase of theatre tables and other related machinery and equipments.

The hospital administration has been patronizing and supportive. Yet, like the proverbial poor mother, it has thirty-five other children to look after. The financial constraints overwhelm our desire to

## Work Performance

The OT Complex became functional on 13th September 2007. Only three operation theaters were commissioned for general surgery cases. Later on three more operation theaters were assigned for General Surgery. In January 2008 ENT surgeries were started in two more theaters

and in February 2008, EYE surgeries started in yet another two theaters. In August 2008 two more theaters were assigned to super surgical specialties viz. Oro-maxillo-facial surgery,

The Dowite 78 Operation Theater Complex consists of 14 Operation Theatres, each having about 400 sq. ft. space and is attached with an

elevators and the presence of high tech staff is all possible at reasonable expense. The supplemental in- house janitorial department to keep the complex immaculate also needs further support.

An auditorium with a seating capacity of 200 is built on the third floor of OT Complex. Live demonstration of surgical procedures from any of the OTs can be performed with two way audio communication between the surgeon in the OT and audience sitting in the auditorium. The O.T. Complex has conducted more than 35 seminars and live surgical conferences, workshops, teaching session, lectures and monthly clinical



and a store. Operation Theatres have been equipped with requisite modern equipments. Medical gases and suction are centralized. All operation theatres are equipped with the modern Heat Ventilation Air Conditioning (HVAC) system units having antibacterial filters and 6 air changes per hour. The system is in line with international standards. The recovery area, consists of two suites and is located between the two wings of theatres. It has a capacity to manage 21 post operative patients at a time.

Continuous service for ongoing surgery has become possible with the provision of 450 KVA

Building of this mammoth project was an uphill task; its continuous functioning is a challenging job and a unique experience.

Plastic surgery, pediatric surgery and vascular surgery. Presently out of 14 theaters 13 theaters are functional. The number of surgeries performed till 31st May 2009 has exceeded 10,852.

Surgeons from six general surgery units, ophthalmology unit II, ENT unit I & II, Oro-maxillo-facial unit, Pediatric surgery unit, Plastic and reconstructive surgery unit, Vascular Surgery unit and Neurosurgery unit are operating at Dowite78 operation theatre Complex.


Out of the 10,852 patients, 1684 were Minor surgical procedures, 7578 were major surgeries and there were 1590 extra major Surgeries.

Some of the special cases done by the ENT department included FESS, Ear reconstruction. Tympanoplasty, Myringoplasty, Mastoidectomy, Laryngectomies and Radical Neck dissection. Attention-grabbing cases of the Eye department, requiring special skill included Evisceration, DACE, indirect laser ptosis surgery, vitrectomy, keratoplasty and retinal detachment. Special emphasis has remained on posterior chamber surgery. The team of plastic surgeons did some special cases like palatoplasty, rhinoplasty grafting and BRACA I & II. A number of the special cases of vascular surgery were repair of major arteries and nerves, endartrectomy, femoro-poplited Bypass grafts of major arteries, and abdominal aortic aneurysm resection. The department of pediatrics surgery did a few special cases like arterovenous fistula Braca 1, DP flap rotation & IMF and poswillow Bone hook technique.

Out of the total number of 5973 cases of all six department of surgery, some of the cases requiring special surgical skills included Anterior resection, Laproscopic APR, Oesophagectomies, Radical gastrectomy, Gastrojejonostomies, hepatojejonostomies, spleenectomies, Mastectomies and Hepatic lobectomies a few to mention among many others.



## Creating Future, Bringing sight to life

#### Prof. Mohammad Idrees Adhi

The field of Ophthalmology has seen a revolution during the last few years. This has completely changed the outlook of management of the routine and complicated eye problems. It is all the more important in Pakistan, considering the fact, that our country is included among the developing countries which are inhabited by 80% of the blind population of the world. We have very high figures of blindness due to cataract, glaucoma and corneal diseases. The exact figures of blindness caused by diabetes are yet to be known in Pakistan. We need to explore what is happening to our infants when they survive the intensive care after premature birth. A lot of these infants become blind due to retinopathy of prematurity. Many of the young ones die, due to retinoblastoma, a cancer in this age group. We have yet to identify the burden of inherited eye diseases causing blindness. Age Related Macular Degeneration (ARMD) is another problem; we need to look into, to treat this blinding condition in our aging population.

Our other challenges include learning new skills, keeping pace with

the changing trends of practice, training the juniors for future and doing research. All this need a strong political will, which unfortunately, is lacking altogether. Just a little more than 1% of GDP is allocated to the health sector by the government in the annual budget. This is obviously insufficient for the vast majority of our population which belongs to the poor socioeconomic group. While working at public hospitals like ours, we see hundreds of such patients faced with blinding diseases, but with resources too little to afford expensive treatments. Even with the best of their efforts and cooperation, as is

visible with the present hospital administration, it is not possible to cope up with the increasing cost of health care in general and ophthalmology in particular.


This gloomy picture motivates people like Professor Shafiq-ur-Rehman. The untiring efforts to look for the help of affording people and NGOs are made, and as a result, places like Dowite78 Operation Theater Complex come into existence. At Dowite78 Operation Theater Complex all investigative and operative procedures are done FREE OF COST. This includes all the expensive operations of cataracts with intraocular lens, glaucoma operations and surgeries for retinal detachments apart from other necessary eye operations. These surgeries cost Rs.20,000 to Rs.75,000 in private practice. During the last year we performed 1156 eye surgeries which included more than hundred retinal procedures with no cost to patients. More than 700 retinal angiography procedures (the procedure costs Rs.8,000 to Rs.10,000 in private practice) were performed during the last two years, on a machine donated by one of the



philanthropists. Laser treatment for diabetics, ultrasound examination and visual field testing is also available to all these deserving patients. Recently we have acquired latest machines for most scientific evaluation of retinal diseases, the RETCAM AND OCT machines costing more than 22.5 million rupees financed by the Edhi foundation. By utilizing these machines, we will be able to provide state-of-the-art care to our

> non-affording patients. As with all treatments provided by Dowite78 Operation Theater Complex, this service will also be free of cost.

> Sight is a basic human right and one should not go blind due to lack of money. It is amazing to see people coming and helping for a genuine cause in this rather disappointing existing health care system. With their help we are able to provide comprehensive eye service to the deserving patients. If somebody wishes to see this happening, he can come and visit Dowite78 Operation Theater Complex. This has to continue and for the continuity we need your help.

Prof. Manzar Salim, a legend in his own right, suffered a fatal Acute Myocardial Infarction on the morning of 16th August, 2008 at home.


A man of principles and well known for his organizational skills, who touched the life of many a people, he was working as Prof. of Surgery, Dow University of Health Sciences and Civil Hospital, Karachi.

He was presently Chief Editor of Pakistan Journal of Surgery and

Surgeons' Newsletter of the Society of Surgeons of Pakistan. He was also clinical tutor of Royal College of Surgeon, Edinburgh and Secretary of Pakistan Medical Journalist's Association.

Prof. Manzar Salim was an Executive Member of Dowites78 Operation Theatre Welfare Society DOTS and actively participated in the building and functioning of Operation Theatre Complex.

He is survived by his wife, son a third year student at Dow Medical College and daughter, a second year student at Sindh Medical College. He will be always remembered as a man of principles, admired by both friends and foe alike.



Sabiuddin Ahmed

The first Patron-in-Chief of Dowites 78 Operation Theatre Welfare Society DOTS® and the sitting judge of Supreme Court of Pakistan Justice Sabihuddin Ahmed died in Karachi on Sunday 19th of April, 2009, due to brain hemorrhage.

60 years old, Justice Sabihuddin Ahmed was appointed Chief Justice of the Sindh High Court on 28.04.2000. He declared some land mark judgments on constitutional laws

Justice Sabihuddin Ahmad was born in

1949 at Hyderabad (Sindh). He received his earlier education in different parts of the country. He did M.A. from Punjab University in 1969 and LL.B. from Karachi University.

The deceased judge of SC was the founder member of the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan and its Vice President (1987 - 1990). He was an elected member of the International Advisory council of the International Centre for Promotion of Human Rights (Interights) and steering committee of the South Asia Forum legal education on gender issues.



### Election 2009


