11TH HANDS ON CADAVERIC TEMPORAL BONE DISSECTION WORKSHOP

The Department of Otorhinolaryngology, Head, and Neck Surgery, Dr. Ruth K.M. Pfau Civil Hospital Karachi, has been a pioneer in organizing hands-on cadaveric temporal bone dissection workshops in Pakistan. Our journey of organizing these workshops started in 2005 when the First Hands-On Cadaveric Temporal Bone Dissection Workshop in public sector was held under the esteemed leadership of Prof. Dr. Jawed Alam at DUHS. Since then, this tradition has been continued with determination to the present. The Department's commitment to advancing medical education is evident through its consistent efforts to foster practical skills among healthcare professionals. Maintaining our tradition and keeping in view the exigent need to arrange such a workshop for the speedily expanding fraternity of young ENT surgeons, the 11th Cadaveric Temporal Bone Dissection Workshop was held on December 15–16, 2023, under the esteemed supervision of Prof. Dr. Zeba Ahmed.

The Dow University of Health Sciences continues to play an important leadership role in promoting education and the dissemination of knowledge, which brings about advanced health care in the country. This initiative not only showcases the commitment to excellence in healthcare but also underscores its role in creating a platform for experts to collaborate and share insights. We are delighted to be able to present an event that was organized on the very foundation of bringing together experts to offer a series of diverse continuing education programs in the field of otorhinolaryngology.

In December 2023, the Department of ENT—Head and Neck Surgery, Dr. Ruth K.M. Pfau Civil Hospital Karachi, demonstrated pioneering efforts in education by arranging a hands-on temporary bone dissection workshop under the esteemed supervision of Chairperson ENT-DUHS Prof. Dr. Zeba Ahmed. This workshop exemplified the commitment to the education and training of young surgeons and signified a proactive approach toward practical skill development.

The 11th Cadaveric Temporal Bone Dissection Workshop was a training workshop funded by the Higher Education Commission, Sindh. It was held on December 15–16, 2023.

Day 1 consisted of the inaugural session held at DIHPE, Dow Medical College, which started with the recitation of the Holy Quran. The Course Director, Prof. Dr. Zeba Ahmed, Chairperson ENT-DUHS, welcomed the patron-in-chief Prof. Saeed Qureshi, Chief Guest Prof. S.M. Tariq Rafi-Chairman HEC Sindh, Guest faculty Dr. Shadaba Ahmed (UK), Prof. Naveed Aslam (Lahore), Dr. Sohail Awan (AKU), Dr. Shaukat Malik, Facilitators, Professors, Faculty Members of the DUHS, registered participants and postgraduate trainees. She also gave tribute to Prof. Dr. Jawed Alam for his legacy and presented the aims and objectives of this workshop.



Following this, a lecture was delivered by Dr. Fahd Haroon a renowned radiologist on "Tips and Pearls of Temporal Bone Radiology" which added valuable insights.

After a short refreshment break and a memorable photography session, the hands-on workshop was started in the Anatomy Dissection Hall of Dow Medical College.

Ten candidates were selected as hands-on participants, and ten candidates were selected as observer participants from all over Pakistan with strict selection criteria. Our aim of the program was to educate and train postgraduates and young practicing otologists. The participants were divided into Groups A and B. A combined demonstration session for both groups was conducted by the esteemed lead instructors, Dr. Shadaba Ahmed, Prof. Naveed Aslam, Dr. Shaukat Malik, and Dr. Sohail Awan.



The demonstration session included detailed insight into ear surgery, including setting up the bone, using a microscope and drill, handling instruments, myringotomy, grommet insertions, perforations, tympanomeatal flaps, myringoplasty, stapedectomy, cortical and extended cortical mastoidectomy, atticotomy, epitympanotomy, and delineation of facial nerves. The demonstration session provided a deep insight into the intricacies of ear surgery, enriching the participants with a comprehensive understanding of the temporal bone anatomy.

After the combined session, Group A participants, consisting of 5 hands-on participants and 5 observers, were gathered in the dissection hall to practice on cadaveric bones.

Meanwhile, participants in Group B had a video session on the anatomical position of the temporal bone, myringotomy, stapedotomy, and cortical mastoidectomy.

The session continued after lunch and a prayer break, and participants of Group B gathered in the dissection hall while participants of Group A had their video session.



On Day 2 of the workshop, i.e., December 16, a combined demonstration session was given on posterior tympanotomy, cochleostomy, cochlear implant, ossiculoplasty, antrotomy, modified radial and radial mastoidectomy, post-auricular facial nerve decompression, exposure of the sigmoid sinus and jugular bulb endolymphatic sac, semi-circular canals, and trans-labyrinthine approach. The video session on Day 2 included videos of posterior tympanotomy, MRM-canal wall down, facial nerve decompression, and internal auditory canal dissection. Both groups practiced on cadaveric bones and had a video session instead.

The workshop session was followed by a presentation of mementos to the Vice Chancellor of DUHS patron-in-chief Prof. Mohammad Saeed Quraishy, Chief Guest Prof. S.M. Tariq Rafi, Guest of Honor Mr. Faisal Edhi, and Course Director Prof. Zeba Ahmed.

The Course Director Prof. Zeba Ahmed, along with the patron-in-chief Prof. Saeed Qureshi, and the Chief Guest, Prof. Tariq Rafi, presented the shield and certificates of appreciation to the Lead Instructors, the Course Co-Director, the Course Coordinators, All the Facilitators, and the Organizers. Certificates of Participation were distributed to hands-on and observer participants of the workshop.

The entire esteemed group of guests and faculty appreciated the role of these sorts of workshops in shaping the generation of skilled and well-rounded healthcare professionals in the field of otorhinolaryngology, ultimately proving to be beneficial for the betterment of healthcare facilities in the community.

In a vote of thanks, Dr. Tehmina Junaid extended her profound gratitude to all the participants to grace the occasion. She also thanked all the team members for organizing this workshop.

Expressing their views, the participants conveyed satisfaction with the meticulous individual attention, effective teaching, and guidance provided by the instructors. Feedback forms were distributed among participants for their suggestions and views. They appreciated the efforts of the team in arranging such an informative training workshop. Events like these help in understanding a topic from the very basic to the advanced level. We, as the faculty of DUHS, intend to organize such fruitful workshops in the future with complete dedication and devotion to the teaching and training of residents and young surgeons.

Sacrococcygeal Teratoma

4-month-old baby was brought to pediatric surgery OPD, CHK with a mass on her lower back since birth. Her parents were so anxious she being the youngest in family of seven siblings. The little girl was born in a village. The parents were devastated to see the newborn with huge mass on her back.

They had been running around from hospital to hospital in hopes of finding a treatment or even a diagnosis. The doctors there reassured them that it will go away on its own but to their utter despair it grew even bigger. Scared, they brought her to CHK where a diagnosis of sacrococcygeal teratoma was made. The parents were told that it was a tumor.

They were shocked when they got to know that it could have caused her hip to displace, her urine and stool to stop, it could have spread to her lungs and if malignant even could be fatal. The workup for tumor was done and a CT scan was obtained for staging. They were relieved to know that the tumor was contained but they were horrified when they found that there was a risk of massive bleeding and rectal injury during procedure. Thankfully, the surgeons and the OT staff saved her and removed the teratoma.

The parents were so relieved to hear that the histopathology report showed that the tumor is fully removed and there is no residual disease. Patient is doing well and on regular follow ups for surveillance to detect recurrence.






Opinion

Notes to the Financial Statements

FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2023

01 STATUS AND ACTIVITIES

DOWITES 78 OPERATION THEATRE WELFARE SOCIETY is a non-profit organization registered on February 24th, 2006, under the Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration and Control) Ordinance, 1961 (XLVI of 1961) given registration No. DSW(2561)-K, and has been granted registration on under the said Ordinance, Dowites 78 has been formed with the primary aim to construct, maintain and extend the operation theatre complex project at civil hospital, Karachi, built by Dow Graduates (Dowites'78) of 1978, which complex/project is consisting of fourteen fully equipped operations theatres in civil hospital premises widely known as Dowites 18 Operation Theatre Complex for the welfare and rehabilitation of patients and to meet its recurring expenditures in the future. The operation of Dowites 78 are financed by donations, grants and endowments (in cash or kind). The current office of the society is located at Dowites 78, operation theatre complex, Civil Hospital Baba-e-Urdu road, Karachi.

02 STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted and best practice Accounting principles and standards as applicable in Pakistan.

03 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

3.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

3.2 PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT AND DEPRECIATION

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any.

3.3 ACCOUNTING CONVENTION AND BASIS OF PREPARATION

These financial statements have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting except for the donations and Zakat which are recognized on receipt basis and historical cost convention.

3.4 TAXATION

The foundation has applied to be registered as a Non-Profit Organization under section 2(36) C of Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 (the Ordinance) and is entitled to tax credit under section 100C of the Ordinance. The provision of minimum tax is also not applicable on the trust under Clause 11A of part 4 of second schedule of the Income Tax Ordinance.

3.5 GENERAL FUND

The fund is used for all general purposes of the society. Any surplus/ (deficit) arising out of operations of the society is transferred from income and expenditure account to this fund.

3.6 CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents are carried in the balance sheet at cost. Cash and cash equivalents. Comprise of cash in hand and cash with banks on current accounts.

3.7 TRADE AND OTHER PAYABLES

Liabilities for trade and other payables are carried at cost which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in future for goods and services received, whether or not billed to the society.
