## WHY IS FOOT CARE IMPORTANT IF YOU HAVE DIABETES?

When you get a foot ulcer, it's important to get care immediately. Most lower leg and foot removals begin with foot ulcers. An ulcer that won't heal causes severe damage to tissues and bone. It may require surgical removal (amputation) of a toe, a foot or part of a leg.

*"At least 35 people in Pakistan lose their lower limbs daily due to diabetes. At least 600,000 people lost their legs in the country by the end of 2022, because of inappropriate healthcare service in the country."*

We, at Dowites78 Foot & Wound Care Centre fighting with this life taking disease by educating people about their conditions, the severity of their conditions. We are trying our best to provide best treatment against Foot ulcers and cure from amputation. About 85% amputations are avoidable if people get the standard treatment on time. The diabetic foot starts from a small blister or wound in the foot of a patient with diabetes and if not taken care of properly in the initial stage, it can lead to amputation and later in the death of the patient.

*Diabetes is a 10-times more serious and lethal health issue for Pakistan, which claims 34,000 lives in a month while Covid-19 has so far caused around 29,000 deaths in the country since pandemic started, according to Diabetic Foot International (DFI).*

The prevalence of diabetes and associated complications in Pakistan is steadily rising. Diabetic foot ulcers and infections place a significant financial and resource strain on healthcare systems by requiring hospital in-patients and outpatients to be handled by primary care and community care services. In terms of overall performance, Pakistan is ranked 154th out of 195 countries. With the limited number of diabetic foot ulcer management centers, Pakistan is ill-equipped to address the problem of diabetes and diabetic foot ulcer complications.

### Prevention

'Feet at Risk' assessment clinics should be established and risk category for each patient must be identified.

Foot care advice should be provided and a concept of Footwear for Every Diabetic patient must be introduced.

Training of footwear technicians has to be conducted under the supervision of international experts. The trained technicians will subsequently conduct a train-the-trainer programme and the establishment of units for the manufacture of low-cost customized footwear must be undertaken.

## PREVENTING FOOT ULCERS

*"Here's how to keep your feet healthy, how to know the signs that mean you need to see a health care provider and what happens if you need an amputation."*

The best way to prevent complications of diabetes — including foot ulcers — is to manage your diabetes. This includes eating a healthy diet, exercising regularly, checking your blood sugar regularly and taking your medicine correctly.

- Look at your feet daily. Check your feet once a day for blisters, cuts, cracks, sores, redness, tenderness or swelling.
- Wash your feet every day. Wash your feet in lukewarm (not hot) water once a day.
- Put talcum powder or cornstarch between your toes to keep the skin dry. Use a moisturizing cream or lotion on the tops and bottoms of your feet to keep the skin soft.
- Don't remove calluses or other foot lesions yourself. To avoid hurting your skin, don't use a nail file, nail clipper or scissors on calluses, corns or warts.
- Don't go barefoot. To keep from hurting your feet, don't go barefoot, even around your house.
- Wear clean, dry socks. Wear socks made of material that pulls sweat away from your skin.
- Buy shoes that fit correctly. Buy comfortable shoes that provide support and cushioning for the heel, arch and ball of the foot.
- Don't smoke. Smoking makes it harder for your blood to go through your body.
- Schedule regular foot checkups. Your provider or podiatrist can look at your feet for signs of nerve damage, poor circulation or other foot problems.

## DEPARTMENT OF OTORHINOLARYNGOLOGY HEAD & NECK SURGERY UNIT-II

**Dow University of Health Sciences Dr. Ruth K. M Pfau Civil Hospital Karachi.**

Karachi: A 3-year-old baby girl presented with muscle deep a throat cut on caused by sharp kite string when she was on a bike with her parents in the Garden East area on Sunday, the 15th of January, 2023.



Soon after the incident, the injured child was shifted to the ENT department of Ruth K.M Pfau Hospital for treatment, where she was managed by a senior postgraduate trainee doctor who after taking all aseptic measures sutured the wound in emergency theater. Luckily she didn't get any airway and Neurovascular injury.

Kites are very popular in Pakistan. Over the years, both kite-flying and kite-making skills have evolved. The conventional cotton threads that were used as kite string (manja) have been replaced by much cheaper and stronger Chinese manja, which is based on nonbiodegradable synthetic fibers. It is hard to break and has caused a sudden surge in dangerous kite string-related injuries. There are a lot of injuries usually sustained by kite-flyers, two-wheeler riders, and pedestrians. These trivial looking injuries can also take the lives of people and cause serious injuries to the victims.

Some precautions can be taken to stop these avoidable situations:

1 : By designating proper places for kite-flying and all other areas including roof tops of residential areas should be strictly prohibited for such activities and strict actions should be taken against such activities.

2 : By spreading awareness amongst common man of its sequel, through electronic media and also by information booklets and pamphlets.

It's a tragedy that a sport was supposed to be safe and enjoyable has turned out to be disastrous due to lack of awareness.

## LIVE SURGERY WORKSHOP ON ENDOSCOPIC SINUS SURGERY OTORHINOLARYNGOLOGY "QUARTERLY ASSESSMENT" PROGRAM DOW UNIVERSITY OF HEALTH SCIENCES, KARACHI PAKISTAN PROF. DR. ZEBAH AHMED

In this rapidly changing world where technology is continuously advancing, there is always more we can do as well as new breakthrough to learn about.

Endoscopic sinus surgery (ESS) has significantly advanced since it was first applied. The introduction of endoscopic examination of the sinuses took place in 1902. Since the 1970s, the techniques applied in endoscopic sinus surgery have been in a constant race with advances in technology with new surgical instrumentation, imaging, simulation, and navigation.

The notion behind FESS may seem straightforward, but the anatomical variability and the broad range and severity of diseases addressed in every FESS remain challenges for the surgeon in every case.

Pre-operative planning for sinus surgery is the crucial step to obtain optimal results and avoid all possible complications.

The Dow University of Health Sciences continues to play an important role in promoting education and dissemination of knowledge, which bring about advanced health care in the country.

The department of ENT head and neck surgery Dr. Ruth KM Phau Civil Hospital Karachi has been a pioneer in student and resident teaching. In the year 2022, the Department of ENT HEAD & Neck Surgery under the supervision of Chairperson ENT DUHS, Prof Zeba Ahmed initiated the "QUARTERLY ASSESSMENT" CME Program to benefit the residents and by its extension the patients as well.

In this connection, on 10th Nov 2022, the Department successfully organized STEP I RHINOLOGY (Functional to Cosmesis). The STEP II RHINOLOGY was conducted on December 12, 2022, in the form of an informative & an amazing keynote lecture on "*Basic principles – Pearls & Tips of Endoscopic Sinus Surgery*" followed by live endoscopic surgery. Complete state-of-the-art 4k Carl Storz endoscopy used for the session at OT COMPLEX- Dr. Ruth KM Phau Civil Hospital Karachi, DMC-DUHS, in collaboration with Professional Development Centre Dow University of Health Sciences.

The surgery was performed by our esteemed guest faculty, Prof. M Rashid, with registered observers, and it was live telecasted in the seminar room where the audience was sitting. It was also broadcasted live on our university website. ENT people in other cities witnessed this academic event in high resolution on Facebook and YouTube. The audience also interacted with the master trainer Brig. Professor Rashid and other experts. The inauguration began with a recitation from the Holy Quran. Course Director Prof. Dr. Zeba Ahmed welcomed the guest faculty, chief guest, and guest of honor, eminent otolaryngologist of the city, professors & faculty members of the DUHS, workshop participants, and a number of postgraduate trainees. She expressed her gratitude to the Master Trainer Brig. Professor Muhammad Rashid from CMH Sialkot, who came to train the candidates as a master trainer, is a renowned otorhinolaryngologist. He has invented three procedures under his own name. He was awarded the BACO fellowship twice. He trained a large number of candidates, both undergraduate and postgraduate.

She also conveyed her gratitude to Honourable Guest of Dr. Shadaba Ahmed for being here from UK, sparing her valuable time to grace the occasion. She is an ENT Consultant at Royal Lancaster Infirmary within The University Hospitals of Morecambe Bay Foundation Trust. She is the first female fellow of FCPS-ENT. She is the incumbent editor of Morecambe Bay Medical Journal. Recently, she edited the book "*Core Conditions for Medical and Surgical Finals*" published by CRC Press. Prof. Dr. Umar Farooq established the first state-of-the-art Functional Endoscopic Sinus Surgery setup in Pakistan in 2000 Karachi, Pakistan. ## RAPUNZEL SYNDROME

An 8-year-old female presented to us with complains of recurrent constipation for 1 year and pedal edema for 10 days. She has history of plucking and eating her hair for 2 years. On examination a weak pale looking child lying in bed with normal vitals and pedal edema. The abdomen revealed a firm epigastric mass extending from left hypochondrium to right, slightly mobile and non-tender. A plain film abdomen showed well outlined stomach consistent with clinical impression of trichobezoar.

After optimizing the patient for hemoglobin and hypoalbuminemia, a laparotomy was done. The stomach was opened between lesser and greater curvature. A large foul smelling trichobezoar was found and delivered after further extending the gastrotomy.

Following delivery of gastric bezoar, with careful and meticulous manipulation, the Rapunzel tail was pulled from duodenum and jejunum intact.

The stomach was repaired followed by abdominal closure.

Postoperative course was uneventful and she was discharged on full oral diet on 7th post op day.

Follow up in Psychiatric clinic reveals no further tendency to plug and eat hair and she was reported to be aware of self-harm. However family was advised to keep a close watch as she is still too young.






Report on the audit of the Financial Statements

### Opinion

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2022

### STATUS AND ACTIVITIES

DOWITES 78 OPERATION THEATRE WELFARE SOCIETY is a non profit organization registered on February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2006, under the Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration and Control) Ordinance, 1961 (XLVI of 1961) given registration No. DSW(2561)-K, and has been granted registration on under the said Ordinance, Dowites 78 has been formed with the primary aim to construct, maintain and extend the operation theatre complex project at Civil Hospital, Karachi, built by Dow Graduates (Dowites'78) of 1978, which complex/project is consisting of fourteen fully equipped operations theatres in Civil Hospital premises widely known as Dowites 78 Operation Theatre Complex for the welfare and rehabilitation of patients and to meet its recurring expenditures in the future. The operation of Dowites 78 are financed by donations, grants and endowments (in cash or kind). The current office of the society is located at Dowites 78, Operation Theatre Complex, Civil Hospital Baba-e-Urdu road, Karachi.

### STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Approved Accounting Standards as applicable in Pakistan. Approved Accounting Standards comprise of internation Accounting Standards issued by International Accounting Standards Committee (IASC), interpretations issued by Standing Interpretation Committee of IASC as applicable in Pakistan and Guidelines for Accounting and Financial Reporting by NGOs/NPOs issued by ICAP.

### SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### BASIS OF PREPARATION

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT AND DEPRECIATION

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any.

#### ACCOUNTING CONVENTION AND BASIS OF PREPARATION

These financial statements have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting except for the donations and Zakat which are recognized on receipt basis and historical cost convention.

#### TAXATION

The foundation has applied to be registered as Non-Profit Organization under section 2(36)C of income Tax Ordinance, 2001 (the Ordinance) and is entitled to tax credit under section 100C of the Ordinance. The provision of minimum tax is also not applicable on the trust under Clause 11A of part 4 of second schedule

**GENERAL FUND**

The fund is used for all general purposes of the society. Any surplus/(deficit) arising out of operations of the society is transferred from income and expenditures account to this fund.

**CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS**

Cash and cash equivalents are carried in the balance sheet at cost. Cash and cash equivalents comprise of cash in hand and cash with banks on current accounts.

**TRADE AND OTHER PAYABLES**

Liabilities for trade and other payables are carried at cost which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in future for goods and service received, whether or not billed to the society
